Responsibilities of the Parish Council

• What is the Parish Council?

A Parish Council is a statutory local authority established under the Local Government Act 1972. It operates in the area of a defined civil parish or group of parishes

• Who is on the Council?

The council is made up of councillors elected by the electors of the parish. Every year the council elects one councillor to be the Chairman of the council. The council has a paid officer who organises meetings and helps to carry out the council's decisions – this officer is known as the Clerk

• What powers do Parish Councils have?

Parish Councils have a wide range of powers. These essentially relate to local matters, such as looking after community buildings, open space, play areas, bus shelters and more. They also have the power to raise money through the council tax (precept)

Responsibilities of the Parish Council

• To Whom are they accountable?

A Parish Council is a statutory local authority established under the Local Government Act 1972. It operates in the area of a defined civil parish or group of parishes

• What are the responsibilities of the Parish Council?

Town and Parish Councils are an essential part of the structure of local democracy and have a vital role in acting on behalf of the communities they represent.

They:

- give views, on behalf of the community, on planning applications and other proposals that affect the parish
- undertake projects and schemes that benefit local residents
- work in partnership with other bodies to achieve benefits for the parish
- alert relevant authorities to problems that arise or work that needs to be undertaken
- help the other tiers of local government keep in touch with their local communities.

Responsibilities of the Parish Council

In practice, what does this mean?

We have a small budget and we need to plan to maintain:

- Playing fields and playground
- The trees in the square
- The pump
- The public toilets
- Dog poo bins

Achievements of the Parish Council

- Northlew news, consultation and relaunch with new editor
- Publication of the monthly Northlew Noticeboard
- Parish Council website maintained and updated
- Maintenance of the trees in the Square
- Maintenance of the Playing Fields (replacement boundary fencing and repairs to entrance, hedge cutting and willow weaving)
- Development of the Playground Working Party
- Christmas tree and lights in the Square
- Additional Dog Poo Bin in Station Road
- Revamp of the Parish Noticeboard
- Consultation on public toilets and possible development of the area


DALC recommend maintaining a reserve of 3-6 months' expenditure based on 2021/2022 figures = £3,896-£7,793

Future Plans


- Consider the responses to the consultation around the public toilets and possible development of the Community Shop in more details, likely formation of a Shop Community Group

Summary of Results of Public Lavatory Survey – 65 responses representing c8% of village population


Q1 Do you currently use the Square Shop, Northlew? 65 responses




Q3 If yes, what is your household average weekly spend at the shop? 56 responses



Q2 If yes, how many times a week? 55 responses




Q5 Do you think the public toilets in Northlew should remain open? 65 responses



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
Q6 Do you think it would be a good idea to extend the toilet block to include a small shop? 65 responses


Q7 Do you think it would be a good idea to include a small covered seating area with a shop? 65 responses








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
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
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




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







Results of Public Lavatory Survey

Q10 Would you be willing to pay a rise in the annual local parish precept (as part of the council tax) 65 responses




Q11 Would you be willing to support the development of the shop in other ways, other than financially?


Q13 Summarise Your Overall Thoughts
