Community landing site for the Devon Air Ambulance in Northlew!

Members of our Parish Council have met with a representative



of the Devon Air Ambulance to discuss the

feasibility of installing a community landing site for the Air Ambulance on the village playing fields. Having a community landing site would mean that the Air Ambulance would be able to land at night as well as during daylight hours which, obviously, would be of great benefit to our community. The Parish Council is delighted to announce that the plaving fields are suitable and the project is now underway. We already have guotes for the cost of the specialized lights and the infrastructure required to support them i.e. a dedicated electricity supply. The total cost of the installation is likely to be in the region of £15,000 (please see the Parish Council minutes the meeting held in January for the breakdown of the costs). This is clearly a 'one off' cost for the community and cannot be covered by the annual Parish Council budget. There are, however, several grants available to support projects like this which the Parish Council is actively following up but the majority of the money required will have to be raised through a fund raising campaign. So, we need everyone's help! Please speak to a member of the Parish Council if you have any ideas for fund raising, would like to volunteer to help with any fundraising events or if you would like to make a donation to The Northlew Community Landing Site Fund (NCLSF).

Gardening Tips for the month



By Harriet King at 'Down to Earth' – Practical Garden Advice

Well there is definitely the first whiff of spring in the air as I write this; Pat's snowdrops are flowering as always in the churchyard. It won't be long now before there's better weather on the way (she says optimistically/tempting fate).

Winter pruning

A fair amount of pruning can take place this month:

Wisterias – if you haven't done so already, then wisterias can be given their winter prune, taking back any unwanted long whip pay growth to 2 or 3 buds.

Winter jasmine with its (slightly garish – sorry) yellow flowers can have all the flowered stems and last year's growth shortened to as little as 2 inches to provide

more flowering spurs for next year.

Evergreen hedges - tough evergreen hedges like laurel can be cut back now.

Clematis - summer flowering clematis can have some stems cut back hard and others left about 3 feet high. This gives a longer flowering season and better foliage cover (clematis don't have elegant 'legs'). Always cut just above a growth bud – leaving lengths of stem on above these buds just invites disease and looks awful as those stems die back.

Heathers - winter flowering heathers can have the stems cut back to just below the old flowers. This helps keep them more compact. Don't cut into old wood as it doesn't regenerate.

Planting

Planting this month can include bare root roses and hedging plants and allium and lily bulbs can still go in now.

Snowdrops

Snowdrops are quite happy growing in large clumps for

years and don't tend to go 'blind' (refusing to flower) like daffodils. However, if you want to spread them around then wait till the end of the month and just lift a clump carefully with a border fork (the bulbs are often much further down in the soil than a trowel can reach) and take out bulbs in sections of 10- 20 and replant where needed. It's one of my favorite jobs – very satisfying.

Weeding

Give your borders a good weed – taking out the newly germinating speedwells and willow herb especially when they are small pays dividends in the months to come.

Food for thought

A new product I'm looking at trialling in a couple of gardens is GroChar from Carbon Gold. Based on charcoal, it increases a plant's uptake of nutrients and is getting rave reviews from growers. I will keep you posted!

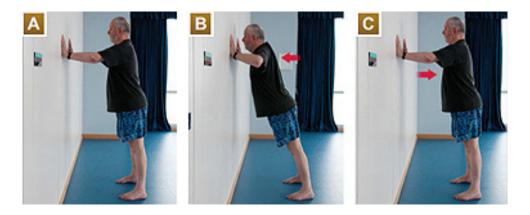

Assisted press ups

The assisted press up is great for strengthening your upper body. By using your bodyweight as a resistance, you can target your triceps, shoulders and core muscle to help improve your upper body strength. This simple, but effective exercise can be completed anywhere in your house and requires virtually no space at all.

Key Points:

- Keep your elbows level with your shoulders
- Try not to let your hips drop
- Feet shoulder width apart

Number of repetitions = 12-15 Number of Sets = 4 Rest time = 60 seconds
