Gardening Tips for the month



By Harriet King at 'Down to Earth' – Practical Garden Advice

I'm keeping fingers crossed for a lovely September and October, as we so often get in the South West...much needed after what feels like a wet summer.

Herbaceous perennials

Towards the end of the month, you can lift and divide clumps of herbaceous perennials that have already finished flowering. This increases your stock of plants and allows you to cut out any old or dying centres with a sharp spade. It is an ideal time of year to do this as the soil is still warm and clumps reestablish fast. Best done on a cool day though when rain is forecast for the following few days. You can also tease out the roots of any pernicious weeds such as ground elder and couch grass ; a fiddly time consuming job, but worth doing.

Final point...it may sound obvious, but do cut down any tall foliage before you move the plants!

Planting for spring

Spring flowering bulbs such as daffodils, scilla and snowdrops can be planted now. I find that snowdrops planted as dry bulbs rather than 'In the green' are less successful, but you get a higher strike rate if they are potted up instead first. They can be transplanted in the Spring. Don't plant tulips till late November or early December this helps avoid Tulip fire.

Amaryllis and hyacinth bulbs can also be potted up now so that they can flower in time for Christmas

Deadheading

Keep deadheading dahlias and penstemons to help prolong the flowering display.

Hardy annuals

Hardy annuals such as cornflowers, ammi majus and calendula can all be sown early Published by the Parish Council September 2017 in the month and planted out in mid to late October in order to make bigger stronger plants next year. If the weather turns very cold early in the season, they can be over-wintered in cold frames.

Ponds

If you have a pond that is near trees, try netting it to stop the leaves from falling in it.

Garlic

The end of September is the ideal time to plant garlic - it's needs a long growth period and winter cold in order to bulb up and form cloves properly. And finally....it is a perfect time to choose and plant new trees and shrubs.....the ideal excuse to go shopping!

Recipes for the month

Tania's Sausage and Apple Pie

Ingredients

Enough shortcrust pastry for the top and bottom of a tin pie plate or flan tin Good sausage meat A large Bramley apple peeled, cored and cut up 1 egg

Method Roll out 2 thirds of the pastry and line the tart tin. Put the apple slices over the pastry and cover with the sausage meat. Top with the rest of the pastry and seal the edges. Decorate with pastry leaves Make a hole in the top and brush with beaten egg.

Bake in a moderate oven (160 degrees or for a 4 door AGA then the middle of the baking oven or a two door AGA, the bottom of the roasting oven) for about 45 minutes until brown and the juices are starting to bubble up through the hole in the top.

This is delicious and can be eaten hot or cold.

Stretch of the Month

Lower back

This month's edition focuses on the lower back. The stretch shown in the diagram below works at targeting the vulnerable area in your lower back that often causes problems. This stretch is a great way to isolate your lower back and glutes and can easily done is a small space. Use your elbow pressing against your knee to apply gentle pressure to increase the stretch



Key Points:

Hold the stretch for 12-15 seconds

Deep breathing throughout

Remember to work both sides

Aim to repeat 1-2 times a day
