A letter from Rev Ruth Hansford

Dear Friends,

November is a time to reflect and remember. On All Souls' Day (Nov. 2nd), we remember those we love who have died. We give thanks for their lives and example, but acknowledge the gap that is left in our lives. Yet All Souls' also reminds us of the Christian belief that, through Jesus, there is resurrection from death, and eternal life. This is the hope to which we hold, when sorrow and grief threaten to overwhelm us, helping us to once again take hold of the gift of life that God has given, and value it in ourselves and in others.

As we move to Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday, our thoughts turn to the many who have sacrificed their lives in the two World Wars, and in many wars since, for the sake of liberty and freedom. The Battle of the Somme, in which one million men were wounded or killed, ended on November 18th 1916. As we see and hear reports of wars on-going in our world today, we remember that each person killed is not an anonymous face on a page of statistics, but a son or daughter, brother or sister, husband or wife, father or mother, lover or friend. They were loved and their death leaves a trail of sorrow and tears. There will not be peace in our world until we all value the other as one who is loved, and whose loss will leave a gap in our lives.

Gardening Tips for the month

Hmm, so much for the Autumn leaf display. At the time of writing, Storm Brian is removing any leaves left other than the beech...and there weren't that many left after Ophelia!

Fallen leaves

So...the first tip is to collect all the fallen leaves and either rot them down in a leaf litter bin made simply of four posts in the ground surrounded by chicken wire, or in dustbin bags with small holes punched in the base. If you can collect the leaves with a mower on its highest setting, so that they are shredded, they will rot down much more quickly into the 'black gold' so beloved of gardeners. It makes a fantastic mulch for woodland plants such as ferns, cyclamen, racers and

azaleas. Whilst it doesn't feed the soil as such, it does condition it, making it easier for small choice woodland perennials to establish themselves.

Tulips

November is the best time to plant tulips. Planting earlier gives a disease called Tulip Virus more chance to take hold. If you're planting in open ground rather than pots and want them to return year after year(don't get your hopes up too high), plant them at least 9" deep and go for red varieties or smaller species tulips such as kauffmaniana or tarda.

Broad beans and peas

If you love broad beans or peas there are a few varieties that will over winter if sown now, to provide much earlier crops than the Spring sown ones. Try Aquadulce Claudia or Super Aquadulce broad beans and Douce de Provence peas (I would suggest protecting these with fleece). You can either sow direct into the ground if your garden is sheltered, or in pots or lengths of guttering which can then be slid into trenches once the plants are a few inches high.

You can even over winter any pot grown ones in a cold frame till Spring which helps confound any marauding mice! Bare root roses, trees and hedging plants are now available - and establish that much more easily than pot grown specimens. They are also usually cheaper.

Holly for Christmas

Cut stems of berried holly and



place the ends of the stems in a bucket of water that is regularly

changed. This should keep them safe from birds who will otherwise strip the berries well before Christmas. Keep somewhere light but sheltered such as an airy light shed or outside in a sheltered spot.

Booking a charitable event at the Victory Hall

4. It must be a public event open to all. This offer is not for private functions.

5. The $\pounds 10$ covers the hall and use of the kitchen for drinks only. If food preparation and serving is required then an additional $\pounds 15$ is essential to cover our extra costs. Any event must meet all 5 criteria to be granted the booking price of £10.

Pineapple Pudding

Ingredients

1 slightly over ripe pineapple 2 heaped tablespoons caster sugar 8fl oz double cream Basic sponge mix using the weight of three eggs in: Caster sugar Butter or margarine Self raising flour

Method

Cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy, gradually whisk in the beaten eggs then fold in the flour.

Peel and core the pineapple and cut into 1 inch chunks. Put 2 heaped tablespoons of caster sugar into a non stick pan and allow to caramelise, without stirring. When a good colour add the pineapple and allow to bubble for a few minutes, add the cream and mix well. Allow to bubble for about ten minutes until reduced by about 1/3. Set aside to cool. Put into a greased oven proof baking dish and spread the sponge mixture over the top. Dredge with granulated sugar and bake in a moderate

oven 160° C for about 45 minutes or until cooked when tested and golden. Serve hot with cream or vanilla custard.

The canvassers will be Locality Officers (David Draper, Sid Easton, Matt Rawlins and Martin Sandys) and the majority of the visits will take place during office hours.

The police have been advised that the Locality Officers will be calling on households but WDBC also just wanted to let parishioners know too. The officers will be carrying ID and will be delivering forms and not taking information at the doorstep, unless it is offered to them. This annual household process needs to be completed in advance of publishing the new Electoral Register on the 1st December.


