Gardening Tips for the month



By Harriet King at 'Down to Earth' – Practical Garden Advice

A different slant to the tips this month. I'm suggesting Christmas gift ideas for any keen horticulturalists you may know.

Gardeners are essentially practical people who appreciate gifts that make their time and work outdoors, easier and more comfortable.

All of the following recommendations are products that I've used constantly over the years in my job and have brought me pleasure from their great design.

There should be something to suit every budget and all the products are widely available online, either directly or via Amazon.

Gardening gloves

Good gloves are an essential. The Showa range are the only ones I use now - specifically, the Floreo 370 lightweight gloves.Strong enough to withstand brambles, but flexible enough for pricking out seedlings and weeding. Around £6 a pair.

Keeping insects at bay

Working outdoors in muggy weather usually means getting bitten unmercifully by midges, mossies and the dreaded horseflies. The one insect repellent spray I've found, that works on all 3, is Highland Strength DEET Free spray. The fragrance is strong initially as it is based on essential oils such as Lemon Myrtle and Geranium, but it then fades deliciously. Around £12 a bottle.

If you prefer not to use sprays to keep insects at bay, then the Craghoppers Nosilife range of clothing has a unique nonfragranced repellent built into the clothing that lasts up to 125 washes. The lightweight travelling socks are incredibly effective and are around $\pounds 17 - \pounds 25$ for a twin pair pack.

Gardening tools

There are hundreds of digging tools available...many of dubious quality. The one I use every day is a Burgeon and Ball Japanese Razor hoe. Made from forged steel and available in left or right versions, it is perfect for hoeing around plants and weeding the cracks in paving. Almost impossible to break - I've had mine for 10 years....it can even help strip ivy from walls Around £12 -

The ultimate in secateurs is of course the Felco range. Priced from around £25 for the 183 Model 5 Economy model, up to £75 for the No7 left handed model. The difference between this range and cheaper models is really marked. In order to keep them sharp, a purpose- made Felco 903 Diamond sharpener is invaluable and can be used on a wide number of tools. Around £20.

Lightweight tools are hugely helpful..the Fiskars range is one of the best. My favourite is the UP82 Bypass Tree Pruner. It allows you to safely stand on the ground and trim branches up to 32mm thick. Around £55.

Making the most of your harvest

Some crops such as apples and tomatoes come in gluts. A food dehydrator can be invaluable for drying large quantities of fruit and veg or even mushrooms. The one I've used for years is the 5 tier Callow Food dehydrator. It doesn't take up too much shelf space and is cheap to run. *Around £50.*

Stocking fillers

And finally, if you want to get a little stocking filler, try getting a packet of unusual veg seeds such as broad bean Red Epicure...pink beans that taste

much better I think, than the green varieties. Available from most seed firms for around £2.50.

5. The £10 covers the hall and use of the kitchen for drinks only. If food preparation and serving is required then an

Christmas Recipes



Healthy Fig Newtons

Thanks to Tom Wilkins for this recipe

Ingredients	
Cookie dough	Cookie filling
1/4 cup (22.5 g) gluten-free	8 ounces (227 g) dried black
oats	mission figs, stems removed
1 cup (112 g) raw almonds	(plus hot water for soaking)
1 cup (100 g) raw pecans	1 tsp orange zest
1/4 tsp sea salt	1/4 tsp ground cinnamon
1 1/4 cups (~250 g) firmly	Pinch sea salt
packed pitted dates (~23-26	8-10 pitted dates (to sweeten)
dates measured after pitting)	optional: 1-2 tbsp. (12-24 g)
	coconut sugar (to sweeten)

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (176 C) and arrange oats and nuts on a baking sheet. Bake for 8-12 minutes, rotating the pan near the halfway mark to ensure even cooking, until golden brown and fragrant. Set aside.
- 2. Once slightly cooled, add oats, nuts, and sea salt to a food processor and process into a fine meal with salt. Remove from processor and set aside.
- 3. Add pitted dates to food processor and mix/pulse until small bits remain or it forms a ball. Scoop out and set aside.
- 4. Add nuts and oats back to food processor and spoon in the mixed dates. Mix/pulse until a loose dough is formed when squeezed between two fingers.

5. Spread the "dough" onto a clean parchment-lined surface and top flatten down with hands. Then top with another piece of

parchment paper and use a rolling pin to flatten into a 1/4-inch thick sheet. Remove top sheet of parchment paper and use hands to form into a rectangle. Then halve with a knife so there are two equal strips.

- 6. Add figs (stems removed) to a mixing bowl and cover with hot (not boiling) water. Soak for 3 minutes, then drain but reserve fig water for later (to thin filling).
- 7. Add figs to food processor and blend into a ball), then add orange zest, ground cinnamon, salt and mix. Add reserved date water a little at a time until it starts to form a paste, but be careful not to add too much - you want it to be thick but spreadable.
- 8. Next add as many dates and/or coconut sugar as desired to sweeten and blend to combine. I used 10 dates and 1 1/2 tbsp. coconut sugar. However, you could also leave it as it is.
- 9. Spread the fig paste (or transfer spread into a plastic or piping bag and "pipe") into 1-inch-thick lines down the centre of your two date-nut strips. Be careful not to add too much filling that your cookie dough can't fold over. You may have leftover filling
- 10. Next use the parchment paper to gently roll the edges of the dough over the fig filling until your two dough ends meet. The dough may crack a little, but because it's moist it will reform as you continue rolling/forming. Like sushi, use the parchment paper to tighten and gently form the seams of the dough together.
- 11. For ease of transfer, cut both of the cookie logs in half and use a spatula or pie server to gently transfer to a parchment-lined baking sheet. Freeze for at least 30 minutes (up to 1 hour or overnight) to set/firm up. Then use a sharp knife to slice into roughly 1-inch slices. There should be about 22-24 cookies.
- 12. Enjoy immediately. Store in the refrigerator in a well-sealed container up to 1 week or in the freezer up to 1 month! They're delicious and tender right out of the fridge.

Jamaican Christmas Cake

It's that time of year again, as promised

here is a recipe for an alternative to traditional Christmas cake. Jamaican cake is a deliciously spiced, warming bake that is perfect for the colder months. Try this instead of your normal Christmas Cake and you'll never look back.

But remember, the key is steeping the cake in plenty of rum during the run up the festivities.

Ingredients

	For the cake mixture
250g dried ready to eat prunes 250g dried ready to eat dates 450g raisins 250g sultanas 200ml port 6 tbsp rum or brandy 100g unrefined cherries	 250g butter 250g dark muscovado sugar 5 size 3 eggs beaten 1 tsp vanilla extract 250g self raising flour 1 tbsp mixed spice 1 tbsp ground cinnamon 100g glace cherries to decorate if liked

9 inch (23cm) round, deep cake tin, greased and lined with baking parchment

Method

- 1. Chop the prunes and dates with scissors and place in a mixing bowl with the raisins and sultanas. Pour over the port and rum or brandy and cover with cling film. Leave for 1 day or up to a week to soak, stirring occasionally. Do not soak the cherries
- 2. Set the oven to 160c, 140c, fan, gas 3, Place the butter and sugar in a large mixing bowl and beat with an electric mixer until light and creamy, then gradually beat in the eggs until smooth, adding a little flour if the mixture curdles. Stir the flour, spices and 100g glace cherries in the creamed mixture with the soaked fruit. Mix well, then spoon into the cake tin and level the top
- Bake for 30 mins, then reduce the oven temperature to 150c, 130c fan, gas 2 for a further 1 ¹/₂ -1 ³/₄ hours until a skewer comes out clean. Allow to cool for 1 hour then turn out and cool on a wire rack. Decorate with extra cherries if liked.

Prawn Toast

Thanks to Tania Haycocks for this savoury recipe

Ingredients

12 peeled and deveined large raw prawns (about 360g)
2 teaspoons rice wine or sherry
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 teaspoons sesame oil
2 egg whites
2 tablespoons cornflour
1 1/2 tablespoons chopped fresh coriander
2 spring onions, finely chopped
10 slices white sandwich bread
Oil, for deep frying

Method

- 1. In a food processor, process the prawns until finely chopped. Add the rice wine or sherry, salt, pepper, sesame oil, egg whites and cornflour. Process until smooth, then stir in the chopped coriander and spring onions.
- Remove the crusts from the bread slices. Spread with the prawn mixture, half the thickness of the bread, all the way to the edges. Refrigerate for 30 minutes or until purée is firm. Cut the bread into triangles and smooth the cut edges if necessary
- Heat the oil in a deep fryer, wok or deep saucepan until a cube of bread fries quickly. Deep-fry the prawn toasts in batches for 2-3 minutes or until golden brown. Remove with a slotted spoon and drain on kitchen paper towels. Serve immediately.


Festive Stretch of The Month

Shoulder Mobility Stretch:

It is very common for people to suffer tightness in their shoulders, this can stem from an injury, muscle fatigue or bad posture. It is extremely important to keep your shoulders mobile through stretching. By stretching it also is possible to help prevent your shoulders becoming tight in the first place. For the stretch below, I have chosen a mobility exercise that has a high range of motion. This will help increase blood flow to your shoulders along with stretching all three heads of your deltoids. A perfect combination for a thorough stretch.




Key Points:

- Use an old broom handle or a stick to perform the stretch
- Be careful when you start off, your shoulders may feel tight
- Aim for 15 repetitions with 3 sets
- Aim to repeat 1-2 times a day


"We came for 2 nights and stayed for 4 - do we need to say any more?"




