A unique historical building in our midst – St Thomas' Church, Northlew

The Church of St Thomas is one of the oldest, if not the oldest, building in the village. Often, when an iconic image of Northlew is sought, it is the view of the church from the lychgate that is chosen serving to emphasise the strong association between the building and the village.

The church and its surrounds have, within living memory, 'always been there', and perhaps understandably are taken for granted: only coming to the fore at times such as baptisms, weddings and funerals. Few would disagree that Northlew would be poorer without the church building, and most would want to see it preserved for future generations.

But – how is the maintenance of this fine old building managed? Is it perhaps by one or more of the following: The Diocese (of Exeter); The Church Commissioners; West Devon Borough Council; The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs; The Historic Buildings Trust? The answer is that it is none of these. The funding of the maintenance of the church building, its fabric and the churchyard is the responsibility of 'The Friends of St Thomas Church' (FOST).

FOST is a registered charity, and oversees the use of funds, largely

originating from bequests, to keep the church building in a good state of repair. Membership of FOST and its committee has never implied a faith or a desire to worship, but simply an interest in the maintenance of a very special old building.

Over recent years the membership of FOST has declined and the organisation has become largely 'invisible'. In order to function properly and to represent the wishes of a wide cross section of the village FOST needs 'new blood'. If you are interested and feel able to attend two short(ish) meetings a year, your contribution would be valued and appreciated.

Booking a charitable event at the Victory Hall

Northlew Victory Hall Management Committee are making a small change to the criteria needed for booking a charity event, as Trustees to NVH we have a duty of care within the charity. We were not covering our costs under the existing £10 fee and so have implemented the below to try and make things fair and clear to all. Criteria to qualify:

- I. Any event for which all the profit will go to the named registered charity.
- 2. Registered charity name & number required when booking and must be on all advertising for the event.
- 3. The organiser is a parishioner.
- 4. It must be a public event open to all. This offer is not for private functions.
- 5. The £10 covers the hall and use

of the kitchen for drinks only. If food preparation and serving is required, then an additional £15 is essential to cover our extra costs. Any event must meet all 5 criteria to be granted the booking price of £10.

Nature Watch: A year in the life of a pond

Having read that a pond is one of the best ways to attract wildlife into your garden, in 2017 I decided to 'create' one at the bottom of mine. This article therefore, is going to take you through my experience of firstly building the pond, and then each month, I will let you know what is going on, throughout the year. Note: this is my experience, and therefore the information should be taken as such.

The build

The location is very important, and should consider the following points:

- a) Don't put it under trees, or in particular shady areas. Leaves can contaminate the water and need to be removed as much as possible. If there is too much shade, it can lead to algae growth in the water, which can reduce the oxygen level.
- b) No matter how big or small, the pond should have a 'deep' area a minimum of 18", and a shallow area with a slope from the deep area to the edge. The deep area will reduce the risk of all the water from freezing up in the winter, and the shallow area will allow wildlife to move in and out of the pond easily. It will also prevent animals like hedgehogs and mice from drowning.

Having chosen the location, you need to decide how you are going to prevent the water from draining away. The most common methods are pre-formed plastic liners, or a PVC membrane. The former is particularly resistant to punctures, but is less flexible than the membrane with regard to the pond shape. Please note, if you go with the membrane, make sure the bottom of the pond has no sharp stones or similar objects, as they

could cause the membrane to puncture. Soft sand or old carpet can be used to line the pond, thus helping to prevent any sharp protrusions.

Filling the pond

Fill the pond with rain water, if you have it, or tap water if not. Once the water has been standing for a few days, any harmful chemicals will have evaporated.

Pond life

Next you need to decide what to put in your pond. Unless it is a really big pond with plenty of hiding places, do not put fish in it for two reasons:

- they may get eaten by a passing heron
- they will reduce the biodiversity of the pond, as they will eat everything.

Plants

As for plants, I bought a Pond Lily, which are great for 'creatures' to rest on the leaves, and a friend gave me some Water Iris. I also put in some pond weed from a pet shop, in order to provide some quick cover, but I think I will be

removing most of that next year, as it is rapidly taking over.
So, that's about it for the set up.

Now you need to wait for nature to find it. More to follow next month.



Bus Routes from Northlew



Every Monday, Thursday and Saturday there is a morning service to Okehampton. The bus will be parked for 2-3 hours outside Waitrose where you can leave

your shopping whilst you visit Okehampton. There is also a service to Bideford which is convenient for Morrisons.



Also, by arrangement, services to Crediton (Tuesdays) Newton Abbot (Wednesdays) and Exeter (Fridays) and in school holidays Barnstaple (Tuesdays) Holsworthy (Wednesdays) Tavistock (Fridays) are available from Northlew.

These services mainly use scenic routes ideal for showing off the area to friends that may be visiting. Bus passes are accepted at all times and if you are not lucky enough to have one then the fares are low. Let the bus take the strain out of driving and no parking charges to pay or spaces to find! Most importantly, if you live on the route then the bus stop is your front door.

Northlew is fortunate to have so many public transport routes so why not leave the car at home, reduce pollution, keep up with local gossip and use the bus!
