Note from the Editor

Vital, extraordinary measures are now in place in these unprecedented times to help limit the spread of the coronavirus.

Staying at home and away from others (social distancing)

The single most important action we can all take, in fighting coronavirus, is to stay at home in order to protect the NHS and save lives. – see the graphic on page 15.

When we reduce our day-to-day contact with other people, we will reduce the spread of the infection. That is why the government is now (23 March 2020) introducing three new measures.

- Requiring people to stay at home, except for very limited purposes
- 2. Closing non-essential shops and community spaces
- 3. Stopping all gatherings of more than two people in public

Every citizen must comply with these new measures.

The relevant authorities, including the police, will be given the powers

to enforce them – including through fines and dispersing gatherings.

These measures are effective immediately. The Government will look again at these measures in three weeks, and relax them if the evidence shows this is possible.

Coronavirus - Northlew Community Support

While we have no real idea of what may happen over the next few weeks and months, it seems sensible to put a couple of things in place to enable us to support each other in Northlew and the surrounding area. For those over 70 and/or with underlying health conditions and who may need support there are options, some of which are already in place.

I. If you have friends, neighbours and family in the area you may

- already have a good support network in place. There is huge goodwill in the village and many people are already helping those who require it. It's a good time to update your contacts list as it may become more important later on.
- 2. There is already a pretty impressive support network on the Northlew and Ashbury Life Facebook page. If you are already on Facebook and need any support like someone to do shopping for you and deliver it to your door, this is a quick way to get immediate help. Already several people who have got an upcoming online delivery order have been happy to add extra goods for those who need them. Post your request on the Northlew and Ashbury Life Facebook page or on the Square Shop Northlew Facebook page.
- 3. If you are slightly more isolated and do not have family nearby and may not have close local friends it would be useful for the community to know who and where you are so that we can make sure that you stay safe and get the support you need. There is a list of local

volunteers and people who need support being collected at the Square Shop Northlew. If you think that you might possibly need support at some point over the next few weeks please add your name and phone number to this list. The intention is to link up volunteers with those who need help or just a friendly phone call.

I'm aware that sharing phone numbers is a sensitive issue so if you do sign up as a volunteer or as someone in potential need of support please be aware that your name and phone number will be shared with others in order to provide the support that is needed when it is needed. This will be kept to a minimum.

In order to start the walk where the Pegasus Trail joins Station Road, walkers were asked to park at Castle Cross, and walk down to the start for Ipm.

Despite this, we set off in high spirits along the old railway track, with great views over Dartmoor. At least the going underfoot was pretty good, and there were plenty of signs of spring, with frogspawn in the many pools, and a few wildflowers braving the showers.

We continued along the track, until we reached Venndown Gates, at which point we turned off the trail. to bring us out to the A3079. Crossing the road carefully, we carried straight on to bring us to Boasley Cross. Turning right, we walked along the quiet lane, enjoying the sighting of three roe deer in the adiacent field. As the heavens opened again, we eventually came up to a track and footpath heading off to our left towards Bratton Clovelly. Taking this track, the going was good, with no mud, no hills, and it stopped raining.

It couldn't last of course, as we turned right off the track, we initially headed downhill, to reach a stream and plenty of mud. After crossing the stream, we then had a fairly steep climb to negotiate, to eventually reach Grindhill. Looking

back, we were treated to excellent views of Dartmoor, Brentor, and even Bodmin Moor when the clouds momentarily lifted.

After walking back up to the road, it was time for a quick rest, and the usual photoshoot. From here, we turned left to shortly bring us out onto the Bratton Clovelly road, and after another drenching, turning right, brought us back up to Castle Cross.

After a good walk in excess of 5.5 miles, plenty of mud, and a few soakings, we all deserved welcome refreshments at the Green Dragon, with lovely homemade cake, thanks to Vicky.



Losing one of our most abundant native trees will have a massive effect on our landscapes, hedges and the wildlife they support. Dying trees adjacent to highways and other public places also pose safety risks to people.

Over 90% of ash trees in Devon are likely to be infected with the disease. 448,000 ash trees are within falling distance of a highway in Devon. 99% of these trees are the responsibility of private landowners.
